## GOLF ASSOCIATION HIGHLIGHTS

**New Members.** The process for joining the Association has been streamlined. Apply direct to Leon Meshel, 37 Brookhaven Avenue. The cost is \$5.00 (\$2.00 initiation fee; \$3.00 1965 dues).

**Tournament.** Every member, beginners included, should participate in this no-entry-fee tournament. Merely play any two of the Middle Island nine-hole courses (total of eighteen holes) with another member, any time through May 2. Keep score on the card which was sent to you, stamped BERA; identify yourself with name and life number; have the other member attest the card and send it to Jerry Weiss, 34 Railroad Street. Cards received after May 4 will not be counted. Don't worry if your score is astronomical--in a Callaway tournament, anyone can win.

**Handicap.** It is to teach member's advantage to establish a handicap. Send any and all scorecards for complete or partial rounds to Frank Walsh, T-100. You can play on any course provided it has a par of 70 or higher, and you need not play with another member. Be sure your name and life number and the date appear on the card. Handicaps will be calculated monthly starting June 1, with a minimum of 72 holes required.

**Lockers.** Members can purchase daily use of locker and locker room at Middle Island for \$5.00 for the season. Cost to the public for a private locker is \$50.00! Apply at the Recreation Office.
