Dr. Hendrie Appointed To Advisory Committee


Chairman Glenn T. Seaborg of the Atomic Energy Commission has announced the appointment of Dr. Joseph M. Hendrie, Nuclear Engineering Department, to the AEC's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards.

The Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards is one of the statutory committees of the AEC. It is responsible for reviewing safety studies and facility license applications referred to it, and making reports thereon. It advises the Commission with regard to the possible hazards of proposed reactor safety standards.

Dr. Hendrie, a physicist, joined the staff of the Nuclear Engineering Department at Brookhaven in 1955. He was Project Engineer for the BNL High Flux Beam Reactor and is at present engaged in the development of advanced research reactors.
