New Traffic Rules

Many drivers on site have been driving in violation of the new parking law. According to Section 375 (2) (a) of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, it is illegal to use only parking lights on a moving vehicle when headlights are required.

Motorcycle operators are also affected by the new additions to the law. Section 1132 forbids them to ride on the right or between lanes of traffic. Also, Section 381 (5-9) which will be effective January 1, 1967, requires all motorcyclists to wear a protective helmet with goggles or a face shield. Passengers as well must wear helmets. This equipment must be of a type approved by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.

Also, many cars have been noted with old "10-66" New York State license plate stickers. These vehicles are overdue for new registration stickers and the owners liable to receive a summons after November 15. Such owners are urged to re-register their vehicles immediately.

These new rules will, of course, apply here on the site, as does the rest of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. —William Barnes

The Caine Mutiny

This film, one of the finest to depict the consequences of weak and ineffectual leadership in a society, stars Humphrey Bogart, Van Johnson, Jose Ferrer, and Fred MacMurray. "The Caine Mutiny" deals with the captain of a U.S. Navy destroyer in World War II, and his relationship with the officers and men under his command.

The ship *Caine* is in itself a society in which certain rules of conduct and behavior must be followed, if the ship is to function as an effective unit. When the Commanding Officer is himself not able to fulfill his role in this society, because of his weakness, the behavior of the rest of the ship is altered to such a degree that they violate the strictest rule in the U.S. Navy.

It is interesting to explore how the *Caine* may parallel conditions in our own environments. —M. Dorin


—And all the Laboratory vehicles have been prepared for the season: snow tires, heaters, and antifreeze included.
