## New Traffic System In Warehouse Area

## Operation Clean-Out

During the past several years, the quantity of records and reference material housed in Laboratory offices has continued to grow until more than 12,240 cubic feet, the equivalent capacity of 2,040 file cabinets, are now stored in Laboratory work areas. In addition, it is estimated that office accumulations of books, periodicals, technical reports, and other reference materials equal or exceed the record holdings.

The AEC has designated the month of January 1967 as a time for all Laboratory employees to participate in "Operation Clean-Out," and to reduce the record holdings at the Laboratory.

The objectives of "Operation Clean-Out" are two-fold:

1. To reduce by 20% the volume of records in Laboratory offices either by destruction or by transfer to the Records Center.

2. To release file cabinets, bookcases, shelving, and other filing equipment for redistribution.

It is hoped that all BNL employees will cooperate in making "Operation Clean-Out" a success at the Laboratory.
