CENTREX Happy Cutover

At midnight Friday the old switchboard will be kaput. Old cables will be cut and Centrex will take over.

It will be a happy cutover to most of the Lab and to most people who call from off-site, only if a small amount of patience and understanding is exercised during the first couple of days of Centrex operation.

It is important to resist the impulse to pick up the phone on Monday morning and "try a few numbers" to see if the system works. It is also important to look up a number first before picking up the receiver. If the operator must be "flashed" do it only once. Jiggling the button will only cut you off.

Calls from offsite to old extensions will be intercepted and the new extension will be relayed to the caller. Remember, the first day of operation will be a trial for callers and operators alike, so restraint in the use of the Lab telephone system should be the order of the day.

The major features of the change to Centrex are:

- Every extension will have a new number.
- BNL will have a new number - 516-345-2123.
- You may receive calls directly rather than via the BNL operator. Get those postal cards mailed to save time for you and your correspondents.
- Outgoing service will remain unchanged for most of us. However, some extensions will permit direct dialing to a wider area, some to a lesser area. Pages III and IV of the new BNL Directory describe the service in some detail. The information on access codes and dialing instructions on page III are particularly important.
- Transfer of all incoming calls FTS and Bell System can be made. See page VIII for instructions.
- FTS usage remains unchanged except that your number is new. The new FTS Directory has been distributed throughout the AEC and contains the new BNL numbers.

The "Treatment" your extension has may be a question for you. Your Departmental Administrator's office or Division Manager's office should have this information.

Our operators have received training on the new equipment that replaces the switchboards and they are ready to do their utmost to provide good service. However, you can help too.

- Do not make unnecessary calls.
- If you have questions that cannot be deferred, call Al Laurine on 2550, Anita Anger on 2000 or Bill Webster on 2525.
- Do not make unnecessary calls.
- Use the forms on page XXXV of the Directory to advise of corrections that should be made to the BNL Directory.
- Do not make unnecessary calls.

An errata sheet will be published late in June.

The final briefing session is at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, June 1st in Berkner Hall, last chance.

Last but not least, all toll calls except FTS calls and message unit charges will be charged to the line number originating the calls.

Traffic Note

Recently there have been complaints received from personnel working in the Grounds Maintenance and Motor Vehicle Shop area, to the effect that private cars are using their work yard as a through traffic shortcut.

This area, between Yale Road and Princeton Avenue, is a series of parking lots and narrow alleys in and around buildings #326 and #321. It includes the gasoline pump area, and is frequently congested with parking utility vehicles, road equipment, and maintenance supplies. It does appear that motorists, presumably from the apartment area, are unable to resist driving through this complex to avoid the intersection of Princeton Avenue and Upton Road.

Laboratory Traffic Regulations as well as those of New York State forbid driving through parking or utility areas to avoid a traffic control device. In addition, the area in question is restricted to Laboratory vehicles and the private cars of those who have business there only. Most important, however, is the fact that attempting to use the area for through traffic endangers those who work there.
