## More Net Pay

New Federal tax withholding tables have been issued which reflect the 10% reduction in withholding rates for wages paid after June 30, 1983. The reduction will show up in the net pay of weekly employees on July 8, and of monthly employees on July 29. This is the third and last withholding rate reduction authorized under the Economic Recovery Act of 1981.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) alerts consumers to the hazards associated with the products listed below and offers advice on how to handle them. Item	Problem
Button batteries used in watches, calculators, cameras, hearing aids, games.	An estimated 500-800 are swallowed each year with occasional severe complications and even fatalities. Batteries can lodge in esophagus or intestine, slowly leaking alkaline electrolytes and causing internal burn.
Chimneys for wood-burning stoves, fireplaces; especially metal factory-built units.	An estimated 22,500 house fires each year are associated with chimneys due to improper installation; structural damage from burning creosote; corrosion; buckling and collapse of inner liners.
Roof-mounted attic ventilators (Broan model 346, Nautilus model N346) with Westinghouse motors.	Westinghouse and Broan have announced a voluntary recall of these units because they may be miswired and may overheat, causing fires.
Honeywell V8280 gas combination control valves used in heating appliances and fueled by LP gas.	The valves regulate gas supply and shut it off when pilot light goes out. A CPSC complaint alleges that the valves' stop mechanism design is defective and certain controls made from 1961-74 have knobs that can become stuck in the ON position, defeating the internal safety valve. If valve doesn't work and pilot goes off, unburned gas will pour into the furnace when the thermostat calls for heat. The gas can accumulate and explode if an ignition source is present.

### To Prevent A Problem

Keep out of reach of children; never put in mouth for any reason; check medications before swallowing so as not to mistake batteries for tablets.

Be sure chimney was properly installed; check regularly for creosote buildup or physical damage; have damage repaired; have chimney checked by chimney sweep annually, or more often if used heavily.

Determine if you have a recalled unit. Broan or Nautilus logo will be embossed on dome outside house; check model # on unit in attic: motor has Westinghouse sticker with model # E322P159, painted gray with SER\*79 date code - \* = letter on bottom.

Check valves. They are cited units if marked Honeywell on the control near the on-off knob, with a PILOTSTAT number (C5281, CS5281, C5223, C5278, CS5278, C5296, or CS5296) and model number on side. **Be careful**—if any odor of leaking gas is present, immediately contact gas supplier for help. Do not use matches or any other ignition source.

Disconnect or turn off unit. For free, new motor and installation call Westinghouse, 800-821-7700, ext. 133; for more information, call hotline.

If knob is stuck ON, immediately contact gas supplier, then call CSCP hotline. Also call hotline to report complaints and incident data.
