How to Get Angry at Everyone!

If you *never* get angry with *anyone*, or if you're mad as hell and you're not going to take it anymore, or if you don't get mad, you just get even — then the next Outreach workshop is for you.

Sponsored by BNL's Employee Assistance Program, "Using Anger Constructively in Relationships" will be presented on Tuesday, June 2, from noon to 1 p.m. in Berkner Hall. The speaker will be clinical psychologist Eva Feindler.

Arising from the human aggressive drive, anger is a strong feeling of displeasure aroused by a real or supposed wrong. It can mask other emotions, such as indignation, humiliation, frustration, fear or territorialism. Many people are overwhelmed by their anger — afraid to recognize it within themselves, let alone share their angry feelings with their significant others in a way that does not harm the relationship. Anger denied, however, builds up within, only to be expressed passively through depression, substance abuse and the like, or acted out later through inappropriate rage.

After discussing anger *per se*, Feindler will outline a model for managing anger in relationships, including self-instruction, relaxation techniques, coping strategies, assertiveness training, and self-monitoring of conflict experiences and anger expression.

Eva Feindler received her Ph.D. in clinical psychology from the West Virginia University in 1979. At present, she is the Director of Psychological Sources Center and an associate professor of psychology at the C.W. Post campus of Long Island University.

Tennis Anyone?

Two tennis-court reservation systems will go into effect on Monday, June 8. Starting next Friday, June 5, reservations can be made for weekdays, 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 4:30 to 7 p.m. The rules for court use are posted courtside and in the BERA Sales Office, Berkner Hall.

Under advance reservation system A, three courts may be reserved for weekday play the day before play. If two players are not on court within ten minutes of the reserved time, the reservation is forfeited. For this system, all lunchtime play is limited to one hour.

For system A, make reservations on sign-up sheets at the BERA Sales Office, from noon to 1:30 p.m. on the day before play; reserve Monday play on Friday. The person who signs up must be one of the players.

On-court scheduling system B offers the three remaining courts on a first-come, first-served basis to players who sign the blackboard at courtside at the time of play. Under this system, all lunchtime play is limited to 1½ hours, and reservation sheets will be posted courtside each morning.

Group 3—Immediate family members of Lab employees.
