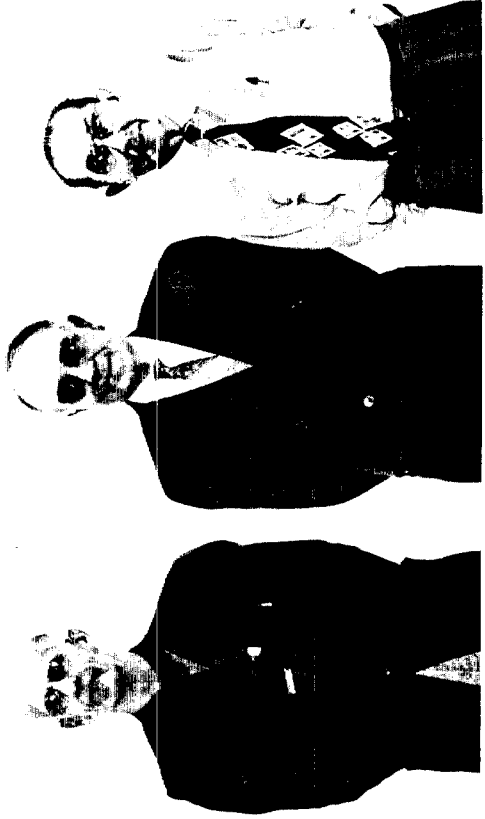

FIVE BNL EMPLOYEES TO RETIRE DECEMBER 31

With the exception of Joe Panuska, who came to the Laboratory in 1948, all have been at BNL since 1947. Dr. Patterson worked at Columbia University with the earliest planning group which established AUI and BNL from November 1946 until the group transfer to BNL in February 1947 when he became Assistant Director. Both Mr. Fowler and Mr. McDonald worked on site before there was a BNL — they were employed by the War Department at Camp Upton during World War II.

EDUCATIONAL FILM BEING MADE AT BNL

On Friday, December 18, a motion picture crew began work at BNL on an educational film on neutron physics research. This film is being prepared by a non-profit group known as Horizons of Science, with the assistance of a grant from the National Science Foundation. A number of other films in this series, all in color, have already been distributed to schools. Among these are: "The Worlds of Dr. Vishniac", which shows the life functions of protozoa, under 50 to 1000 times magnification;

"Project Mohole", a status report on the scientific project to drill through the "Moho" discontinuity into the earth's mantle; and "Thinking Machines", which shows the capabilities and limitations of electronic computers. The film being made at Brookhaven will show

the research of Dr. D.J. Hughes, the research reactor, Cosmotron, bubble chambers and the AGS.
