Safety and Compliance are Values

- Priorities change, values never do
- We are the same at work, home, and play

Building Toward Excellence

- Safety topic first on meeting agenda
- Don't just be visible, be engaged
- Ask for feedback, then act on it
- Insist on good housekeeping
- Don't walk past a mistake

Building Toward Excellence

- Focus on Tier 1 inspection effectiveness
- Avoid “compliance blinders”
- Digital photos of good and bad
- Results should be communicated by line management and tracked to closure
- Use results as safety topics
