

1. Safety Topic, R. Selvey

- Ticks and Chiggers
 - We are in the beginning of tick/chigger season
 - If you find a tick on you, remove and bring to Bob Selvey to analyze it.
 - 3 types of ticks are found on Long Island:
 - Deer tick
 - Dog tick
 - Lone star tick
 - Lone star ticks are the newest ticks to be found on Long Island
- Questions/Comments
 - It should be noted that one employee was bitten so badly by chiggers last year that it resulted in a DART case (days away from work)
 - Even Tyvek suits do not keep the larvae out. They are small enough to squeeze through the smallest hole in the suit.

2. Guest/Visitors Medical Treatment, J. Falco

- If a guest/visitor were to come in with a serious issue, the OMC would not hesitate to assist. But they prefer not to delve into a personal medical condition so they tend to refer to an outside physician.

3. IH Monitoring Update, R. Selvey

- IH Monitoring needs calculator data moved to an IH Monitoring scheduler database.
- 2,723 sampling events need to be done. This includes noise, welding, chemicals, etc. This does not include surface wipes.
- We've had 2 ORPS noise overexposures this year.
- A plan has been worked out with BHSO where all high priority sampling will be done first followed by mid-priority and low-priority.

4. 1st Quarter Performance & 10CFR851 Update, P. Williams

- BHSO is not happy because they believe we will not make our TRC and DART performance measures.
- We currently have 18 out of 22 recordable cases and 4 out of 9 DART cases.
- Try to get contractors to report their hours worked. This is something that is now included in our contract performance measures. We must track contractor hours and injuries.
