"Richard Dyer-Bennet is one of America's most interesting artists," the New York Times reported a few weeks ago, "and the fidelity of his following was attested again on Saturday night when an audience of more than 1200 turned out for his annual Town Hall recital. The tenor and guitarist is that rare combination: a musical scholar who is also a talented performer. Because of his skill he created the old magic with familiar songs. Because of his interests he also gave his listener selections that were new."
