CONCERT SERIES ANNOUNCED

The B.E.R.A. concert group is planning a series of three or more concerts for the 1950-51 season. The membership fee for the group is \$5.00 per person and each member is entitled to admission at all the concerts of the season. The concert committee, consisting of Gerhart Friedlander, Chairman, Dave Alburger, Irving Kaplan, and Ben Rubin, promises a minimum of three concerts and as many more as possible. The more members we get, the more concerts we can have. Each \$5.00 contribution entitles you to one membership; so if you have friends who would like to come to these concerts, be sure to subscribe for them too. Single tickets for individual concerts will not be available.

Final plans are not yet complete for all the concerts. But negotiations with a number of top-flight artists are now underway and we are assured of a fine series. We hope to have the first concert in December. One event definitely arranged for early January is a recital of violin and piano sonatas by Israel Baker, violinist, and Yaltah Menuhin, pianist, a team which has won wide acclaim at the West Coast for their "brilliant performance," "convincing interpretation" and "immense potentialities" and which, this winter, is going to appear in the East for the first time. Further details of this and other concerts will be announced in the near future.
