NOTE WELL -- The capacity of the gym is about 800 persons. This means only 800 tickets will be sold. With such a well-known orchestra playing you must get your tickets early. NO TICKETS WILL BE SOLD AT THE DOOR and when the 800 tickets are gone no more will be sold.

The dance is intended primarily for the pleasure of Lab employees and families. While others will not be prohibited, it is requested that guests be kept to a minimum.

CAFETERIA PRICES

In spite of rising costs, prices in the cafeteria have remained substantially the same for the past two years. This has been possible through the adoption of rigid operating economies and a two cent increase in coffee and tea prices last fall. However, during the last three months the cafeteria has shown a substantial net operating loss and plans to adjust prices in fair proportion to the increased wholesale costs have received certification from the Economic Stabilization Agency.

Therefore, starting Monday, April 2nd, all beverages such as tea, coffee and juices will sell for ten cents and all desserts such as pies, puddings and ice cream will sell for fifteen cents. Besides the above, there will be some increases in a few other items in order that they may carry a fair share of the increased wholesale costs.
