M. HORSZOWSKI - PIANIST

The BERA Concert Group is pleased to present the renowned concert artist Mieczyslaw Horszowski in a piano recital, Monday, October 22nd. Mr. Horszowski is one of the few child prodigies who fulfilled the promise of his early career. At the age of five he had amazed European critics by his performance from memory of the Inventions of Johann Sebastian Bach. By the time he made his first New York recital appearance in Carnegie Hall at the age of 14, this gifted child pianist had made several tours of Europe, had played as soloist with symphony orchestras in the principal European capitals, and had given a recital before Pope Pius X. In his early years he met Joseph Szigeti, the violinist, with whom he has played and recorded many sonatas for Columbia Masterworks. Horszowski is, perhaps, even better known for his artistic collaboration with Pablo Casals, the illustrious Spanish cellist and conductor. Together they made many tours of Europe doing programs of Bach, Beethoven, and Brahms, and once played all five Beethoven concerti in a monumental cycle of Beethoven works under the direction of Casals. Horszowski has also played on European tours with the London Symphony orchestra and has collaborated in performances and recordings with Rudolf Serkin and with the Budapest Quartet. In his frequent solo appearances in New York he invariably wins the unanimous applause of the Manhattan critics. Typical comments are "... masterly pianism, notable for its musicality and charm ..." (The New York Times), "... few pianists play with such beauty, such distinction, and such unflinching seriousness of thought ..." (New York Herald Tribune)

Mr. Horszowski has chosen an interesting and well balanced program for presentation at his Brookhaven concert. The selections and composers are to be as follows:

(First Performance in United States)
Kreisleriana, Op. 16 (Dedicated to his
friend Chopin) Schumann
(In 8 movements)
Le Tombeau de Couperin (Suite pour le piano) Ravel
(In 6 movements)
INTERMISSION
Sonata in C Minor, Op. 111 Beethoven

Alburger, chairman of the Concert Group. The price of \$5.00 entitles the holder to admission at all five concerts of the series. Membership cards may also be obtained at the door on the night of each concert. If you desire to attend only one or two of the concerts, single admission tickets will be sold at the door at \$1.80 including tax. However, attendance at three or more of the concerts costs more by single admission than by membership in the group.
