Everyone who heard the Juilliard String Quartet play here last year will be pleased that this group of fine young musicians is coming back for a return engagement. Founded about five years ago with the aid of the Juilliard Musical Foundation, the Quartet is in residence at the Juilliard School of Music in New York, and its four musicians are members of the ensemble faculty of the School. The members of the Quartet are:

Robert Mann (violin) - born in Portland, Oregon, graduated from the Juilliard School in 1943, and winner of the Naumburg Award in 1941;

Robert Koff (violin) - a native of Los Angeles who received his training at Oberlin Conservatory of Music and at the Juilliard School;

Raphael Hillyer (viola) - born in Ithaca, New York, who attended Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, Dartmouth College and Harvard, and was a member of the Boston Symphony Orchestra until 1946;

Arthur Winograd (cello) - a native of New York City who received his musical education at the New England Conservatory and Curtis Institute and who later played in the NBC Symphony Orchestra.
