The B.E.R.A. Concert Group will present The Albeneri Trio on Monday, November 26. This ensemble is now in its sixth season and is enjoying increasing popularity. In a recent poll of Louisville, Kentucky concert-goers the Trio's concert was voted "best of the season" against such competition as the Minneapolis and Cincinnati Symphony Orchestras, Artur Rubinstein, Helen Traubel, Isaac Stern, Larry Adler, Sigmund Romberg, Victor Borge, and Stan Kenton. The Budapest Quartet was voted second best.

The artists, Erich Itor Kahn, pianist, Giorgio Ciompi, violinist, and Benar Heifetz, 'cellist, were born in Germany, Italy, and Russia, respectively, and each has a wide and varied musical background. They have combined their talents to form probably the best existing trio. Their most recent concert was presented by the New Friends of Music in Town Hall last Sunday (November 11). Of this the New York Times wrote "The performance, as one would expect from this sturdy ensemble, was notable for its solid musicianship and thoughtfulness, if not often for exceptional tonal beauty." The FM broadcast of this concert over WABF was heard by this writer and was considered truly excellent.

The Trio will play a program which promises to be interesting and worthwhile. This will be as follows:
