FILM STUDY GROUP ANNOUNCES NEW PICTURE SERIES

On Monday, February 19th, the last picture in the winter series was shown to the BERA Film Study Group at the BNL theatre. At that time, ballots prepared by Dave Balber and Connie Murphy were distributed to the audience. As a result of the voting, pictures will now be shown twice a month on Monday evenings at 8:30 P.M. starting in March and continuing through the summer. Based on the expressed preferences and availability, the first series of six pictures has been booked and will be presented as follows:

The March screenings are of particular interest. ODD MAN OUT, a J. Arthur Rank production starring James Mason, Robert Newton and Kathleen Ryan, has won wide critical acclaim in this country. It is the story of eight tense hours in the life of an idealist who defies heavy odds in defense of his convictions. James Mason portrays an Irish revolutionist who is forced into desperate flight. A memorable midnight scene brings the ruthless manhunt to a brutal climax.

GRAND ILLUSION is a tremendously successful picture which was issued about 1937. It is a trilingual - French, English and German - portrayal of heroism and the misery of war. Some of the finest actors appear in this vignette of World War I - Erich von Stroheim, Pierre Fresnay, Jean Gabin and Dita Parlo.

The present price policy of \$1.50 a person for a series membership or 45¢ a person for each picture will remain in effect. Series tickets will go on sale next week in all departments.
