BERNARD GREENHOUSE CELLIST

Bernard Greenhouse, the young American cellist who will appear in the second concert of the current Fall-and-Winter Series has established himself in the front rank of present day musical artists. Mr. Greenhouse leaped to fame in 1946 when he made his Town Hall debut at which time Virgil Thomson of the New York Herald Tribune wrote: "Bernard Greenhouse is a mature musician and an impeccable executant. If you can imagine a whole evening of cello music without one false note, one groan or one scratch, you can also figure out why the hall was full of cellists. The news had obviously got around that the boy is good." Since that time concerts throughout the United States have won him extraordinary acclaim from musicians and critics alike. He has been called "a man who can make his cello sing", "a highly accomplished cellist whose interpretations tarried on a consistently high plane of excellence throughout the evening," "a cellist of quiet and impressive sincerity,.. a fine and sensitive musician." Iaklo Casals with whom Greenhouse studied in 1946 paid tribute to him as "not only a remarkable cellist but, what I esteem more, a dignified artist."

For his BNL concert Mr. Greenhouse has chosen the following program:

- Bach, Sonata No. 1 in G major
- Schumann, Stuecke in Volkston
- Joaquin Nin, Suite Espagnol
- Debussy, Sonate
- Locatelli, Sonata in D major
