medical research when the American Medical Association sponsors an NBC network program, 1:30 to 2:00 p.m., Sunday, May 4. (WNBT, Channel 4)

The program will mention production of radioisotopes by the Brookhaven reactor, and television cameras will pick up the story of their separation in the adjoining Hot Lab. Most of the half-hour, however, will be televised direct from the Brookhaven hospital. This part of the program will show actual use of radioisotopes in medical research.

The program will be supervised by Dr. W.W. Bauer, director, Bureau of Health Education, American Medical Association, Chicago. Ben Grauer, as master of ceremonies, will interview the following Brookhaven staff members: Dr. Lee E. Farr, chairman, Medical Department; Dr. Donald D. Van Slyke, senior scientist; Dr. F. Marott Sinex, biochemist, and L.G. Stang, leader, Hot Lab Group.
