REGINALD KELL CHAMBER FLAYERS

The BERA Concert Group is pleased to present, as the last concert of the season, Reginald Kell and his Chamber Group. Mr. Kell left his native England in 1948 to live in the United States but his fame as a clarinetist had already been established for many years by his recordings.

Kell's training began at an early age and his accomplishments were such that at 25 he was made a professor at the Royal Academy of Music in London. He was one of the first members of the London Philharmonic Orchestra formed in 1932 by Sir Thomas Beecham and later he appeared as soloist with most of the leading orchestras and chamber groups in the British Isles. In 1939 Toscanini invited Kell to participate in the Festival of Music in Lucerne, Switzerland.

Since Kell's appearance in this country his audiences have been fortunate in hearing many of the beautiful but rarely performed works in the clarinet literature. His recent recording of the Mozart Clarinet Quintet was voted "best chamber music record of the year" by the New York Music Critics' Circle.

Assisting Mr. Kell will be Isidore Cohen - violin, Helen Bullis - cello, and Joel Rosen - piano, and the program will be the following:
