FIRST CONCERT OF FALL - WINTER SERIES

Thursday, Oct. 9

The first concert of the Fall-Winter series, featuring music for wind instruments and piano, is scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 9, 1952 at 8:30 PM in the Research Staff Lounge.

The artists are: IRENE ROSENBERG, piano. Miss Rosenberg made her debut in New York at the age of 12, winning acclaim as a prodigy of phenomenal musical talent. More recently, she has concertized extensively in this country and Europe, appearing as soloist with the Boston and Chicago Symphonies, eliciting such comments as "One of the most distinguished and articulate pianists this reviewer has heard in recent years" (N.Y. Herald Tribune).

JOSEF MARX, oboe, formerly with Palestine Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony and Metropolitan Opera. He is now engaged in recital work and heads a music publishing house specializing in music for wind instruments.

GUNTHER SCHULLER, horn, first horn player of the Metropolitan Opera; also a talented composer.

ARTHUR WEISSBERG, bassoon and IRVING NEIDICH, clarinet, members of the Longine Sinfonietta.
