JOEL ROSEN, Pianist

Wednesday, March 25, 8:30 P.M.

Program: Haydn, Sonata in D; Schubert, Impromptu Op. 90 No. 3; Schumann, Carnaval; Prokofiev, Sonata No. 3; Brahms, Intermezzi in B flat minor and C sharp minor, Capriccio in B minor; Chopin, Andante Spianato and Grande Polonaize.

Joel Rosen is the young pianist who was so well liked here last year when he played with the Kell Chamber Players. This time he returns to us as a soloist and he has chosen a very interesting program for his BNL recital.

Mr. Rosen, a native of Cleveland, began his musical studies at the Cleveland Institute of Music when he was five years old and gave his first public recital at the age of twelve, followed by appearances throughout Ohio. After completing his training at the Juilliard School he made his successful orchestral debut at the age of nineteen in Cleveland with a performance of the Chopin E Minor Concerto. Subsequently he toured the East and Midwest in recital and as a soloist with orchestras. For the past four years Mr. Rosen has appeared with Reginald Kell, the eminent clarinetist, in sonata recitals and chamber music concerts throughout the United States and Canada, as well as on nationwide radio and television broadcasts. They have also recorded together for Decca.

BNL is not the first AEC establishment to hear Mr. Rosen. When he played at Oak Ridge, a critic said he "distinguished himself as an extraordinarily competent pianist. He played with an assurance that belied his 24 years." Other reviewers have called him "a truly outstanding performer", "a musician of fine sensitivity", "a pianist of clear and melting tone, crisp technique and poetic instinct", "a youthful musician of amazing powers".
