## JOAN OF LORRAINE

Theatre

The Theatre Group's spring play -- Maxwell Anderson's "Joan of Lorraine" -- starred Ingrid Bergman when it appeared on Broadway in 1946-47. A motion picture version followed which, however, dealt only with the life of Joan of Arc and had little to do with the play you will see. "Joan of Lorraine" is a play about people rehearsing a play about Joan of Arc. During the course of a day's rehearsal you meet the actors, the director and stage manager, the stage hands; you find out what they think of the play they are working on, and how they meet problems today similar to those that faced Joan in the Fifteenth Century. We think you will like this play. It is amusing -- provocative -- inspiring -- come and see!

The cast is a large one; it includes 21 people. They are: Sylvia Stein, Clark Bowen, Donald Fluke, Lynn Paege, Gene Renkin, and Lloyd Schairer from Biology; Keith Rowley, Harold Schwarz and Richard Wolfgang from Chemistry; Martin Rickey from Cyclotron; Mary Kinsley from the Hot Lab; Margaret Fluke from Medical; Joseph Fleck and Leroy Hersh from Nuclear Engineering; George Cox from Photography; Naomi Schroeder from Health Physics; and Jerome Fleeman and Andrew McReynolds from Physics. Also included are Jane Caspar from Patchogue, and Dennis E. Puleston and Peter Collins from Bellport.

The play has been directed by Edward Sayre (Chemistry) and Virginia Sayre (Dir. Off.). The efficient technical staff has also been a large group: Ruth Schwarz (Medical) is Production Manager. Mary Jane Sears (Tech. Information) is Stage Manager. The stage crew includes Al Caretto (Chemistry), James Egan (Cosmotron) and Robert Margulies (Physics). Set construction has been in charge of David Christman (Chemistry) with the help of Marie Moss, Lynn Paege and Lloyd Schairer from Biology; Enid Nash and Terry Satina from Medical; and Richard Boutelle and Byron Keene from Health Physics. Lulu Anderson (Biology) is in charge of props. Costumes have been executed by Connie Moses of Brookhaven, Veda Bowen of the Laboratory apartment area and Margaret Fluke. The Wardrobe Mistress of the production will be Terry Satina. Make-up is in charge of Norma Christopher (Medical), Joan Earl and Jean Rickey (Biology), Rita Leigh of the apartment area and Jane Caspar. Ticket promotion is being handled by Margot Berman and Erwin Berman, both of Biology. House arrangements are being made by Norman Still (Fiscal). Publicity has had the contribution of Marie Moss and John Antal (Biology), Rita Straub (Medical) and Virginia Sayre, and the art work for the programs was also done by Rita Straub.

The culmination of all this planning and working -- and fun -- will be at the theatre, Thursday and Friday evening, June 3 and 4, at 8:15 p.m. Tickets, \$.75 each, can be purchased from Theatre Group representatives, the Recreation Office, or at the theatre before performances.
