THREE—THREE—THREE ONE ACT PLAYS

On August 11 and 12, the BERA Theater Group will present three one-act plays, Shaw's "How He Lied to Her Husband", Saroyan's "Hello Out There" and Rostand's "The Romancers". Although there have previously been several informal readings in-the-round, this is the first time that a major production is being staged this way.

In "How He Lied to Her Husband", Shaw has chosen to examine, not too kindly, the eternal triangle at the moment when it is falling apart. The loyal wife, of course, has never had the remotest intention of leaving her husband, but the poor lover, who is much too young for her anyway, becomes aware of this painful fact only at this moment, and it is indeed a staggering blow. "Hello Out There" also deals with the time immediately preceding a dramatic climax, but Saroyan's treatment is a poignantly tender one. A gambler who is about to be lynched on a trumped up charge finds "the right girl" too late, but leaves her as a heritage the courage to face the dreary pattern of her life, perhaps even with the courage to do something about changing it. How do two doting fathers, in the day of arranged marriages, manage to bring their children together in the great romantic tradition of "Romeo and Juliet", or "Pyramus and Thisbe"? Why, they become arch enemies, provide a wall for the young lovers, and let psychology do the rest. They even arrange an abduction. The "Romancers", with Fran Keene, Don Miller, Noel Corngold, Jerry Lellouche and Ed Sayre, Directed by Jane Caspar.
