TWO ONE-ACT PLAYS

On Thursday and Friday, August 16 and 17, The Brookhaven Theater Group will present, for your pleasure, two one-act plays: Sophocles' immortal Antigone and the whimsical comedy The Apollo of Bellac by Giraudoux. The production will be IN THE ROUND, and the stage will be set in the Gym.

Ginny Sayre (Director's Office) is directing The Apollo. Stage Manager for The Apollo is Keith Rowley (Chemistry) and the cast is as follows: Lulu Anderson (Biology) plays Agnes, Ruth Schwarz is Therese, Wesley Springhorn is the Clerk and Lee Grodzins (Physics) is the Man. The role of Vice-President is played by Sam Markowitz (Chemistry), and John Gorr (Reactor) is Mr. Chracheton. Mr. Lepedura and Mr. Rasemutte are portrayed by Stuart Tanenbaum (Biology) and David Christman (Chemistry), respectively. Don Fluke (Biology) is Mr. Schultz, Ed Sayre (Chemistry) is the President, while Miriam Miller and Walter Hamilton (Chemistry) portray Chevredent and the Chairman of the Board, respectively. Sylvia Springhorn (Biology) will be On Book for The Apollo.

Antigone is being directed by Harold Schwarz (Chemistry). Stage Manager for Antigone is Lynn Paege (Biology), and the title roll is played by Tauby Weichsel (Health Physics). Cynthia Corngold is Ismene, John Binnington (Tech Info) will be Creon, and Joe Fleck (Nuclear Eng.), Don Miller (Chemistry) and Lynn Paege play the Elders of Thebes. Others in the cast are Leo Sartori (Physics) as the Sentry-Messenger, Noel Corngold (Nuc. Eng.) as Haemon, Gerry Lellouche (Nuc. Eng.) as Teiresias, Rita Straub (Medical) as Eurydice, and Tom Binnington as the Acolyte. Eweze Nash (Medical) will be On Book.

The Production Manager is Pepper Fluke. Bill Willis (Cosmotron), Lynn Paege and Lloyd Schairer (Biology) are constructing the sets for Antigone, while Gerhart Friedlander (Chemistry) is directing the lighting, abetted by Don Fluke (Biology), Al Abashian (Cosmotron) and Joan Wasserman (Physics). Properties are Perk Stoenner's department. Miriam Miller, aided by Sybil Sugarman, Lucy Duke (Medical) and Elsie Brown (Medical) will whip up costumes. Rita Straub, with Trudy Neuhoff's (Photo Dup) assistance, will do the makeup.

The House is in the charge of Art Damask (Physics). Art's helpers are Jim Egan (Nuc. Eng.), John Antal (Physics), and Bernie Weiner (A.E.C.). Ginger Hulse (Fiscal) and Regina Buckley (Physics) will usher. Terry Satina (Medical) is compiling the Program and George Cox (Photo Dup) is designing the program cover. The Publicity Committee has Berniece Antal (Medical), Marianne Kugler (Physics), Merle Forman (Cosmotron), Barbara Holtzman (Chemistry), Jerry Hudis (Chemistry), Harriet Christman and Chyh Li Yang on its roll.
