PRESENTATION TO BNL'S 400

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 11,

In recognition of a "Decade of Service", pins and certificates are to be awarded to our first group of employees who have completed 10 years of service at BNL on or before December 31, 1957.

Of our total staff of slightly over 1700 employees, there are 408 in this initial group, many of whom have been with the Laboratory since its beginning.

Dr. Haworth will make the presentations on Wednesday, December 11, beginning at 2:30 p.m., in the Gymnasium.

After the ceremonies there will be an opportunity provided for these "old timers" to chat and reminisce.

The ten-year awards to employees with a "Decade of Service" is a procedure that hereafter will be an annual event.
