This last concert of the season, which was postponed because of the illness of Mr. Mannes, will be presented on April 4.

The members of the Mannes Trio have established enviable reputations for themselves in the world of music. Mr. Mannes, a member of a family in whose life music was an essential part, studied piano with Alfred Cortot, has taught at the Juilliard School, and, in addition to his activities as a performer, is president of the Mannes College of Music. Incidentally, Leopold Mannes and Leopold Godowsky are the coinventors of the Kodachrome process. The violinist, Miss Magnes, made her New York debut in 1946 and has since then appeared as a soloist with major orchestras throughout the world. She has received exceptional recognition, and the Second Violin Concerto of Dohnanyi was dedicated to her. Madeline Foley graduated from the Juilliard School in 1947 and has had a long association with Pablo Casals, both as a protege and as a coparticipant in the Casals festivals. Her performances in Europe and America have been acclaimed by critics in the major journals. The New York Times, for example, stated "A performance of exciting communication and uncommon beauty—a musical event not soon to be forgotten."

The ensemble will play the Trio in E Major K. 542, Mozart; Trio in A, Ravel; and Trio in C Minor, Op. 101, Brahms.
