MAURICE GOLDHABER ELECTED TO THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

Dr. Maurice Goldhaber, Senior Physicist at Brookhaven National Laboratory, has been elected to membership in the National Academy of Sciences. The announcement was made today by Dr. Hugh L. Dryden, Home Secretary of the Academy.

Dr. Goldhaber, who was born in Lwow, Poland, received his PhD at Cambridge University, England in 1936. After a professorship in physics at the University of Illinois, he came to Brookhaven in 1949 as a visiting scientist, and joined the staff as a Senior Physicist the following year. At Brookhaven, Dr. Goldhaber has specialized in the study of nuclear isomers and fundamental particles.
