## DR. JACOB BIGELEISEN OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTOR TO ATOMIC ENERGY RESEARCH

One of BNL's scientists left for San Francisco to receive the American Chemical Society's highest award for his "outstanding contributions" to atomic energy research.

The award winner, Dr. Jacob Bigeleisen of Bayport, is believed to be the youngest scientist to receive the honor since the society instituted the award in 1953. Bigeleisen, a 39-year-old senior chemist, last year received nationwide recognition for his work with isotopes.

Working with Dr. Maria G. Mayer of the University of Chicago, Bigeleisen developed a simple but vitally important method that enabled scientists to measure the chemical differences between atomic isotopes that have almost identical properties, such as hydrogen and "heavy" hydrogen.

Bigeleisen will receive his award at the society's 133rd annual meeting at Nourse Auditorium in San Francisco.
