SET SHOTS

ADD has not received many headlines this season, but the team should be commended for its consistent hustle and fine turnouts.

The Phoubars, playing without two of their aces, Jackson and Carstens, could not find the range in the first half, and Biology never relinquished its lead. MEDICAL RESEARCH CENTER DEDICATION

On Tuesday afternoon, December 16, 1958, at 2:45 p.m., a brief dedication program for the new Medical Research Center is being held in the Theatre. The dedication follows the Conference of Medical College Deans held here on December 15 and 16, under the auspices of the AEC and the BNL Medical Department.

The Dedication Address, "THE ATOM AGAINST CANCER", is being given by Dr. Shields Warren, Pathologist, New England Deaconess Hospital, and Professor of Pathology, Harvard Medical School. Dr. Warren was the first Director of the AEC's Division of Biology and Medicine. The dedication speech follows remarks by John A. McCone, Chairman of the AEC, and C. Hamilton Sanford, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of AUI. Dr. Haworth is presiding at the ceremony. Dr. Lee E. Farr, Medical Director, is speaking on medical research at Brookhaven.
