If you like, bring a guest or two. Remember, though, guests must be accompanied by a BNL employee in order to gain admission. Price of admission for guests: \$2.00 per person.


Oops, almost forgot . . . there'll be mixers, beer, hot dogs, sandwiches, and coffee on sale at a nominal fee.
