Demonstration and class organization will be held on Wednesday, January 16, at 8:30 p.m., in the Recreation Building.



**SOCIAL SECURITY**

Some married women still carry the same social security cards they had before they were wed. They fail to make the necessary changes for months, or even years, after they have changed their names from Miss to Mrs.

The key to your social security record is your social security account number card. No one should have more than one social security number, yet it is possible to have more than one card under different names. In the interest of having all earnings properly credited to the proper account number, the Social Security Administration needs to know about changes in names, whether it be because of marriage, divorce, or other reasons. Women who marry and fail to report this change may experience delay when it is time to figure the social security benefits due them.

It really is a simple matter for a newly married woman to insure that her social security records are current and correct under the proper name and number. If you can, it is best to bring your old social security card to the nearest social security office. In Patchogue the address is 38 Oak Street - GOver 5-3031. The social security office will issue you a new card with the same account number you had but under your new name.

When a club was not led at either table, there still remained the prospect of two club losers, even if the diamond king was right. After two trump rounds showed there was no entry to dummy outside the diamond suit, both declarers hit upon the winning play. A small diamond was led and ducked in dummy. East won and returned a club. Declarer won, drew the last trump, and diamond queen. When the diamonds broke 3-3, declarer's two losing clubs were thrown away on the long diamonds.
