BERA FILM SERIES

LES LIAISONS DANGEREUSES

Thursday, July 25, 8:30 p.m., Lecture Hall



For two years this film version of Laclos's scandalous novel was withheld from export by the French government as "detrimental to the French character." It outlines, in some detail, the tactical maneuvers in amorous games played by Messr. and Mme. de Merteuil (Gerard Philipe and Jeanne Moreau). This happily married couple makes a hobby of seduction, each with the other's full consent, and often with the other's assistance in planning. Roger Vadim, in his best film to date, has handled all these wicked shenanigans with relentless Gallic wit. He has managed to present a serious condemnation of immorality, but has a lot of fun doing it.

The NEW YORK HERALD TRIBUNE had the following to say about this week's film: "But far from being a mere exploitation of questionable subject matter, the acid sharpness with which Vadim inspects these people and their society implies an outraged sensibility taking up arms against this particular species of ethical suicide. If he laughs occasionally, there is an edge of bitterness in the laughter."

DR. TAPE

SWORN IN AS AEC MEMBER

Dr. Gerald F. Tape was formally sworn in as a member of the Atomic Energy Commission by Chairman Glenn T. Seaborg at a ceremony at 9:15 a.m. on July 17, at the AEC Headquarters, Washington. Mrs. Tape attended the ceremony. Also present were Charles Johnson, representing the White House, AEC Commissioners Palfrey and Ramey, AEC General Manager Luedecke, and Dr. L.J. Haworth.

President Kennedy nominated Dr. Tape for AEC membership on April 3. The U.S. Senate confirmed the nomination on June 24.

Dr. Tape joined the staff of Brookhaven National Laboratory in July 1950, and became Deputy Director in 1951. In 1962 he was elected President of Associated Universities, Inc.

FREE POLIO SHOTS


