## PAYROLL PROCEDURES FOR 4th OF JULY HOLIDAY

Thursday, July 4 and Friday, July 5, will be observed as Laboratory Holidays. All weekly employees' pay checks will be distributed at the bank on Wednesday, July 3, 1963. No pay checks will be available before 9:45 a.m. on Wednesday. The bank hours on Wednesday will be 9:45 a.m. to 12:00 noon and 12:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Shift employees who are unable to pick up their checks during these hours may have the checks mailed to them on Wednesday, July 3, by leaving their name, address and life number with the Cashier no later than Monday, July 1, 1963.

Because of the short work week, all time cards must be in Payroll no later than 9:00 a.m. on Monday, July 1. Supervisors are requested to deliver time cards in person (do not send through mail). The Fiscal Division will not be able to guarantee that pay checks will be available for employees whose time cards are received late. Therefore, it is important that all weekly employees and their supervisors complete their time recordings and approval procedures promptly.

### NEW OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR THE BROOKHAVEN CENTER

**Purpose:** The Brookhaven Center is an integral part of the operation of the Laboratory, and provides facilities for both official and unofficial meetings of Laboratory personnel, meetings of the Visiting Committees and the Board of Trustees, scientific conference, and other similar gatherings. The operation of the Center is a responsibility of the Director's Office. It is not connected with BERA, nor is it intended that it supplement BERA or BERA functions.

**Luncheon Club:** All persons employed by BNL, AUI, and the AEC are eligible to join the Luncheon Club, which is in operation at the Center. Each member is assessed \$2.00 per month, receives a membership card, and is billed monthly. Members may bring guests. Lunch is served five days a week, between the hours of twelve noon and 2:30 p.m. Applications for membership should be submitted to the Luncheon Club House Committee. (Presently to Clarence Hammond).

Temporary employees and guests of the Laboratory may apply for Guest

Cards. Holders of Guest Cards will be expected to pay cash.

**Taproom:** The Taproom will be open from 5:00 p.m. to midnight seven days a week June through September. From October first through May it will be closed on Sundays. The Taproom will serve a dinner menu, beverages, sandwiches, and coffee. **All charges incurred at the Taproom must be paid in cash.**

**Tipping:** Tipping of Center employees is not permitted.

**Special Functions:** The facilities of the Center are available for special functions related to the Laboratory and its operations. Scheduling must be arranged with Mrs. M. Kuper or some other person designated by the Director.


