
The Brookhaven Center will be closed during the day but will be open in the evenings from 5:00 p.m. to midnight.



NO VISITORS TO NEW CONSTRUCTION SITES

General visiting by BNL employees at the sites of the various construction projects at the Laboratory is not permitted. Laboratory employees who are not directly concerned with the construction, but who have more than a casual interest in a particular project, must make prior arrangements for visiting the construction through the BNL Department concerned. Such visits will be scheduled, hard hats issued, and a guide provided.

PATENT ISSUED FOR BNL EXHIBIT STANDS

A patent dated August 13, 1963, has been issued by the United States Patent Office for an exhibit stand designed by George R. Cox, Chief Illustrator at the Laboratory.

One of the most difficult of display problems is the portable exhibit, which must be set up and disassembled at each display site by people who are totally unfamiliar with it. The exhibit must be simple, rugged, and protected from the loss of vital small parts and fastening tools that are usually built into the design. These qualities, however, are difficult to combine into an attractive display stand. Most stands are therefore either bulky when disassembled or quite unattractive in appearance.

The exhibit stands invented by Mr. Cox, with considerable assistance from the Sheet Metal, Carpenter, and Electrical Shops, achieve the dual qualities of easy portability and good looks. They are constructed of pairs of bent and welded aluminum tubing, which provide lightness and strength. As can be seen in the photograph above, simple light fixtures are an integral part of the stand. Four-by-eight feet plywood panels, with the exhibit material painted or installed on them, are hung on the frames. The entire exhibit can be assembled without special tools by untrained personnel.
