


J. GREENER AND R. SEATON RETIRING MAY 31

Radioactive Wastes (continued)

Humm, Jr., Everett L. Sawyer, and Edward J. Walsh. The courier car in which the men lived for three days was located in the center of the 2000 foot train. The men, who never left the train, ate all meals on board with Art Humm, acting chef, cooking on an old woodburning stove.

These radioactive wastes have been stored at BNL in an isolated, fenced-off area since 1960. They consist mostly of contaminated steel piping and other laboratory wastes of all kinds, fission products from the Research Reactor, and slurry solidified with cement. At Oak Ridge, the vaults have been off-loaded into trucks and transported to a permanent radioactive waste burial ground on the Oak Ridge National Laboratory site.

Prior to 1960, such wastes from BNL were loaded into concrete containers and dumped by U.S. Navy ships in the Atlantic Ocean some 200 miles offshore in the deep waters beyond the Continental Shelf.

SOCIAL SECURITY

QUESTION: How do I find out whether all my wages are being reported for social security purposes?

ANSWER: You can get this information from the national record-keeping headquarters of the Social Security Administration. Your local social security office has a handy pre-addressed postcard form designed especially for this purpose. Fill out this card and mail it. In reply, the Social Security Administration will send you a statement of the earnings they have credited to your account. You can then compare this information with whatever earnings records you have; for example, wage slips and W-2 forms. If the information from the Social Security Administration does not agree with your own earnings record, visit your local social security office for help in getting your earnings record corrected.
