

BRIDGE LESSON

Bidding and play must not be considered separate entities. Many fine players are capable of mastering intricate bidding conventions and are adept at both dummy play and defense. But they often fail to listen carefully to the bidding and take advantage in the play of the information they obtain.

Take the test yourself. Look only at the NS cards and the bidding. Then plan your play at a three-heart contract against a king of clubs opening followed by a switch to the diamond jack. EW is vulnerable.

Would you say that the bidding is peculiar? Yes, it certainly is. When opponents holding twenty-four high card points, at least two doubletons, and nine cards between them in their best suit sell out so easily, it certainly indicates something. The EW hands must be quite balanced. Surely neither of them has a singleton, and you should plan your play on this assumption.

A straight cross-ruff will almost surely net just eight tricks. The correct play is to take the spade finesse immediately. If it loses, and West returns a diamond, you ruff. Then trump a club, play the ace of trumps, and ruff your last club. Return to the closed hand with a spade and play a trump. You now have two trumps to the enemy's one, and must win nine tricks. If the spade finesse wins at trick three, you will make an over-trick.
