BERA FILM SERIES TWO DAUGHTERS



Thursday, July 16, Lecture Hall, 8:30 p.m.

For the centenary of Rabindranath Tagore, Satyajit Ray adapted two short stories of the Nobel Prize-winning Indian author into the film, "Two Daughters."

In "The Postmaster," a young man from Calcutta becomes postmaster of a small village, inheriting from his predecessor a nondescript hut and an illiterate child for a servant. A bond develops between the two. She nurses him through a bout of malaria. He teaches her to read and write. But snakes, utter boredom, a village madman, all prove too much for the city youth in the end. As he starts back to Calcutta, the child passes him on the road without a sign of recognition - the final scene of what is probably the most exquisite vignette ever filmed.

Mrinmoyee is the second daughter, a beautiful and carefree tomboy in "The Conclusion." How her rebellious spirit is tamed is related in uproarious fashion by Ray, who, as in his Apu trilogy, continues to reach the hearts and minds of men and women far removed from the exotic settings of India.

Winner of the David O. Selznick Golden Laurel Award at the Berlin Film Festival, "Two Daughters" received unanimous critical praise:


