LOWER WITHHOLDING RATES MAY NOT COVER YOUR 1964 TAX LIABILITY!

Among the many provisions contained in the 1964 Revenue Act are reductions in individual income tax rates and modifications to the Sick Pay Exclusion, effective January 1, 1964. Also, effective with payroll checks issued after March 4, 1964, the withholding rate of taxable wages was reduced from 18% to 14%.

The effects of these changes will of course vary from one individual tax situation to another. You may be home safe. But it could be that the one-step reduction in withholding rates (as opposed to the two-step reduction in taxes, taking place in 1964 and 1965) will leave you with a substantial tax liability at the end of the year. The following examples may be helpful to you in judging how you stand:

Based on the above example, employees A and B must pay additional amounts of \$160.02 and \$24.56 when they file their 1964 Federal Income Tax Return. (It must be pointed out that, although these employees must pay these additional amounts, the total amounts of tax paid are nonetheless lower by \$164.80 and \$82.00, respectively, than would have been paid during 1963.)

After assessing your own outlook for 1964, you may wish to have more money withheld from your wages. You can do so by reducing the number of exemptions claimed on the W-4 form, and/or you may request that an additional amount be withheld from your wages.

Sick Pay Exclusion

The \$100 per week sick pay exclusion for absences commencing after December 31, 1963, is available only when the employee is absent from work for a period in excess of thirty continuous days. The extended waiting period applies whether or not the employee is hospitalized or injured.

Example 1: Employee is absent thirty consecutive days, during part of which he is in the hospital. All wages received during this period are taxable.

Example 2: Employee is absent thirty-five consecutive days. The wages paid for the five days after the thirtieth consecutive day are excluded from taxable income at the rate of \$100 per week.




