


BNL WINS

ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION SAFETY AWARD

The envelopes for our November paychecks will be imprinted with the announcement that the Laboratory operated 2,277,078 accident-free* man-hours last summer. Although this occasions no change to the checks on the inside, one might reflect on its significance to the six or seven members of our staff who were not injured, but who would have been had the past record prevailed.

This is the first time that Brookhaven has been able to reach, and pass, the two-million man-hour figure and total almost twice the number required by the AEC for its award. Not only is this the greatest number of man-hours reached, but it marks the fourth AEC Award of Merit received since 1960! Congratulations to every employee, because it takes every employee to make records like this one.
