## BERA FILM SERIES

Ingmar Bergman's

### THROUGH A GLASS DARKLY



Thurs., July 30 - Lecture Hall - 8:30 p.m.

This first film in Bergman's trilogy examining man's relationship to God describes 24 hours in the life of a family on an isolated island in the Baltic: a young woman, her father, her husband, her younger brother. The woman is a latent schizophrenic, changing swiftly and without warning from apparent sanity to madness, yet aware of her prostration before the dark forces compelling her to degrade herself. Her husband, a doctor, is helpless to prevent her relapse. To her brother, a 17-year-old burdened with problems of adolescence, she represents the female sex with all its mysteries, provoking now repugnance, now attraction, even lust. As Karin sinks into insanity, alone with her brother, his own grasp of the real world is shattered, but in the young woman's ultimate tragedy the son and father make contact with a warmth they have never generated before, and hope is held out to both of them.

Bergman conceived the structure of "Through a Glass Darkly" as a string quartet, with the statement, development and resolution of themes played out with extraordinary subtlety by the four characters in their different voices and temperaments, and indeed this film is the closest possible cinematic equivalent of chamber music. In Harriet Andersson, whose first film for Bergman was made in 1952, the director has an instrument of enormous variety and range, and her creation of Karin is unquestionably the greatest acting achievement in any of his films.
