Mr. Webster came to BNL from the military where he was Director of Training, Naval Air Technical Training Center, Glynco, Georgia.

**LBJ NAMES VAN SLYKE FOR NATIONAL SCIENCE MEDAL**

President Johnson has named Dr. Donald D. Van Slyke, Senior Scientist Emeritus in the Medical Department, to receive a National Medal of Science. Dr. Van Slyke, one of eleven recipients of the award, was honored for his work in the development of analytical methods fundamental to bio-chemistry.

In announcing the awards, President Johnson said that the medals were "a symbol of the nation's desire to recognize outstanding achievement, to set an example for our youth, and to depict to the world the depth and variety of American accomplishments in science and engineering." Presentation ceremonies will be conducted at the White House at a later date.

**DALU TO VOTE ON 3-YEAR PACT**

Representatives of the Directly Affiliated Local Union No. 24426 and BNL have agreed on a new three-year labor contract. The contract will take effect on January 1, 1966 if union members vote to accept the contract.

Ratification meetings are scheduled for Thursday, December 16 at Pulaski Hall, Falcon Ave., Patchogue. A meeting will be held at 1:30 p.m. for members on the night shift; all others will vote at a second meeting scheduled for 8:15 p.m.

**JAMES S. ROBERTSON PROMOTED TO CAPTAIN IN NAVAL RESERVE**

Dr. James S. Robertson, Head of the Medical Physics Division, has been promoted to the rank of Captain in the Medical Corps of the United States Naval Reserve. He is a member of BNL's Reserve Research Company 3-9.

The unit, which is composed of naval reserve officers who are scientists, engineers, or research supporting personnel in civilian life, has several awards to its credit. In 1961, it received the A. Hoyt

Taylor Award for the best research project, and twice, in 1962 and 1964, it won the Naval Research Award for general excellence.

Company meetings are held the second and third Wednesdays of every month at the laboratory, where about fifty per cent of the unit's members are employed. Openings do exist for naval reserve officers who possess scientific, engineering, or teaching skills.

**GROUP MEDICAL INSURANCE**

Dependent children are insured under the Group Medical Insurance family plan until the December 31st after their 19th birthday.

By payment of an extra premium equivalent to the premium paid by a single employee (\$2.47 per month or \$.57 per week), children over age nineteen are eligible under the following conditions:

1. They are unmarried and make their home with the employee;
2. They are fully dependent upon the employee;
3. They are attending school on a full-time basis.

Application for dependent student coverage must be made at the Personnel Office within ninety days of the date the dependent becomes eligible for this benefit. After ninety days evidence of insurability will be required.
