MONTHLY PAY CHECKS



6. If a game is rained out or postponed, refund or exchange should be made at the Ticket Office at the Ball Park.

*If there are tickets which have not been sold one week before game time they will be sold regardless of the number of tickets already in the purchaser's possession.
