BERA Film Series

"The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari"

A major breakthrough in German film making and one of the most famous films ever made, *The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari* is a supreme example of the expressionist films and an ancestor of horror films. It is the tale of a mysterious Dr. Caligari, whose side-show tent attraction is a somnambulist, Cesare, who walks at night to kidnap a girl, Jane. Its famous surrealistic sets, the work of three contemporary impressionist painters, reflect the deranged mental states of the characters.

According to the German film critic Siegfried Kracauer, the story (in the tradition of Hoffman) reveals its revolutionary meaning unmistakably at the end, with the disclosure of the psychiatrist as Caligari. Reason overpowers unreasonable power, insane authority is symbolically abolished.

In view of the events in Germany which followed the making of the film, the movie is even a better one to see.

Short: "Where Mountains Float"

A Grand Prize winner at the 1955 Venice International Film Festival, *Where Mountains Float* depicts the enterprising Greenlanders and Danes from kayak to cutter, from a culture of hunters to a culture of fishermen, in a story spanning three generations of one family. The scenes of Greenland are terrific - grey in rain and white with snow, with every color of landscape, homes, and people.

J.G. Peter Retires; Organizational Changes Announced

Mr. J. Georges Peter is retiring today as Architectural Planning Director after more than twenty years of service at the Laboratory. Employed in September 1946, Mr. Peter was one of the earliest members of the staff, serving first as Manager of Architectural Planning and Plant Maintenance and, more recently, as Director of Architectural Planning.

In these positions, as noted by Deputy Director Clarke Williams in his announcement of the retirement, Mr. Peter has contributed greatly to the transformation of the Laboratory site from a collection of army barracks to an outstanding physical facility for research.

Following Mr. Peter's retirement, he will become a Consultant to the Director's Office. At the same time, the following organizational changes will take place:

Mr. Maxwell M. Small will assume the position of Manager, Plant Engineering and Planning, with responsibility for the operation, maintenance and planning of the general plant. Mr. Small will report to the Assistant Director, Plant Engineering and Operations.

Mr. D.A. MacCornack as Principal Architect will become the Administrative Head of Architectural Planning, and Mr. D.E. Mallory as Plant Engineer will continue as Administrative Head of Plant Maintenance. They will be responsible to Mr. Small for the management of their respective organizations.
