## Open House at New Nuclear Engineering Building 12-157-66



Nuclear Engineering's Radiation Division, headed by Bernard Manowitz, held open house last Friday at its recently completed new quarters. The building is located in the "heart of BNL's financial district," off Brookhaven Avenue between Rochester and Technology Streets, with its main entrance across from the Peoples Bank facility.

Designed by Pierre Mercier of Plant Maintenance, it was constructed from several existing Lab buildings, using as a nucleus Chemistry's old building 318. The new facility has 20,000 square feet of laboratory and office space, housing the major part of the Radiation Division's personnel.

Among the guests at last week's Open House were three members of the Atomic Energy Commission from Washington: E.E. Fowler, Director of the Division of Isotopes Development, and William Mott and George Jordy, Assistant Directors of the Division.

### "Alexander Nevsky"

In 1242, Russia was invaded by the powerful Order of the Teutonic Knights who swept across the Baltic provinces. They were met by the people of the free city-state of Novgorod under their Prince Alexander Nevsky. At Lake Peipus the fierce and decisive Battle of the Ice was fought, and Nevsky won a great victory. From these historical events Eisenstein fashioned a monumental film which is widely recognized as an all-time film classic. The music was composed by Prokofiev in close collaboration with the director. The battle on the frozen lake is probably the finest medieval

battle sequence ever filmed. This version is a complete, uncut edition which has only recently become available. As an example of superb direction and sweeping pageantry, this film should not be missed.

### Short: "Paris Weekend"

A delightful satire on the flight of Parisians to the country for an "idyllic" August Sunday. There is no conversation, but none is needed, for montage, music, and sound are entertaining in a universal language. Traffic, children's wails, cows fleeing from bathers, romances on the dance floor... it is great fun to see that the French have the same problems as we do when we are determined to enjoy ourselves.

## A Four Star Thank You

Each year the young participants in BNL's Summer Children's Recreation Program choose a special project on which they'll work during their seven weeks together.

This summer, the youngsters enrolled in the Program - some 83 of them, hailing from 6 countries and ranging in age from 5 to 12 - broke all time records in arriving at a decision: to a man, they wanted to do something for the soldiers in Vietnam.

Who'd try to change the minds of 83 kids? Under the guidance of Recreation Assistants Kathy Burke and Tom Binnington, a short period each day was set aside for the project, and the group settled down to some intensive creative work. On construction paper, they drew their own inimitable versions of soldiers and planes and flags and ships, and they composed like numbers of inscriptions and poems to go along with them.

As the last days of the Program rolled around, the compositions were put together notebook style between specially constructed covers and, with a little grown-up help, a suitable introduction was written. The "something" turned out to be two feet wide and two feet high! With a justifiable sense of accomplishment (and utter disregard for the high cost of postage!), the kids shipped off their opus to Vietnam.

End of story? Not quite. The kids and their scrapbook made the columns in the Vietnam weekly *Observer*, published for U.S. Forces there. And here's what they recently received in the mail:
