During 1966 Brookhaven National Laboratory reaches a very special milestone: its first employees are completing twenty years of service. In recognition of this, a specially designed new series of awards, to be used for service anniversaries, has been inaugurated by Associated Universities.

In early January, 1946, a group of leading research institutions took the initial steps in an effort to promote the establishment of what would be the first nuclear research center in the Northeast. In a short time, the sponsoring group was fixed at nine universities which undertook to negotiate a contract with the U.S. Government to support the proposed laboratory and to select a suitable site. In March, the group hired the first staff member to devote full time to the project. Using Columbia University as the focal point for activities, the newly-incorporated Associated Universities gathered momentum and a few additional staff members, who completed arrangements for a site and organized the first research projects to be carried out there. In January 1947, the staff at Columbia moved to the site which had been readied on Long Island - and the Brookhaven National Laboratory, operated by Associated Universities, Inc., was open for business.

This week, Mrs. Mariette Kuper and Dr. Clarke Williams were honored by Dr. Maurice Goldhaber, Director, as the first employees to complete twenty years of service to AUI. Mrs. Kuper was the first employee to be hired by the planning group in March 1946. Since that time, she has given distinguished service to the Laboratory in a number of capacities and is now in the Director's Office. Dr. Williams began work for AUI in April 1946. He served as Chair-

man of Brookhaven's Nuclear Engineering Department from 1952 until May 1962, when he was appointed to his present post as Deputy Director of the Laboratory.

As recipients of twenty year awards, Mrs. Kuper and Dr. Williams will be joined this year by seven other Laboratory employees, and during the calendar year 1967, 275 persons at Brookhaven will become eligible for the twenty year award.

The new service award series features a special new design which will be used with different numerals for the ten and twenty year service awards. The twenty year service award is shown in the above photograph. Designed by George Cox of Photography and Graphic Arts, the emblem has a modern motif worked in sterling silver. Its slightly concave background is oxidized, creating an excellent foil for the polished highlights of the emblem design.

All employees eligible for ten or twenty year service awards on June 1, 1966, will be notified by Personnel. From samples available at Personnel, they will be able to select as their award one item from a variety of jewelry carrying the new design. Among the items that may be chosen are pins, charms, tie bars, and cuff links. The presentation of the awards will be made at the appropriate time in the usual manner within departments.

In addition, employees who previously received a ten year award will be able to exchange their old pin for an item of jewelry carrying the new design. A suitable display of the award series will be available at the Personnel Office in the near future.

Beginner - Non-swimmer or not able to swim 30 yards.

Swimmer - Can swim 100 yards but unable to perform all strokes and swim continuously for 10 minutes.
