

BERA Concert Series

The BERA Concert Series will end its 1965-1966 season with a performance by John Corigliano and Heida Hermanns on Tuesday, April 19, at the Brookhaven Center at 8:30 p.m.

Mr. Corigliano has worked with the greatest conductors of the century as an orchestral musician. Since 1943 he has been the concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic; the first American-born violinist to hold this position. His repertoire is unusually varied and he has earned high praise for his performances of over twenty-five concerti.

Miss Hermanns is also distinguished in three major fields of music. She is

renowned as a soloist in the major European cities and in America. At the age of twenty-one she received recognition of the Prussian Govern-



ment for outstanding success as a music pedagogue, and has continued as a welcome stimulus to musical vitality, outlook, and growth.

Brookhaven Lecture Series

“Advances in Applied Irradiation”

Mr. Bernard Manowitz, Head of the Radiation Division of the Nuclear Engineering Department will explore the newest techniques in irradiation at million-curie levels. As part of his program he will show slides and three movies dealing with the status of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's irradiation programs on screw-worm sterilization, the disinfecting of wheat, and the Army Quartermaster Corps studies on meat preservation by irradiation.

The presentation will also deal with the design factors of high-intensity irradiators and the problems of distribution and dosage.

The lecture will be given on April 20 at 8 p.m. in the Lecture Hall. A buffet supper (\$3.25) will be served at the Brookhaven Center before the lecture beginning at 6 p.m. Reservations should be made at least one day in advance by calling Ext. 2453.

New Graduated Income Tax Rates To Be Effective May 1, 1966

A bill recently passed by Congress and signed into law by President Johnson stipulates that new income tax withholding rates will go into effect for all wage and salary payments made by an employer after April 30, 1966. However, this is *not a tax increase*, since your total liability will not be affected.

At present there is a flat 14 percent withholding rate for all employees. The new law replaces that rate with six graduated rates that range from 14 percent to 30 percent.

The amount of tax deducted from your pay depends on:

Whether you are single or married

The number of exemptions you claim on the Withholding Exemption Certificate (W-4)

The amount you earn.

Married persons must file a new Form W-4 to obtain correct withholding under the new system. If no new

W-4 is filed, the laboratory is required by law to treat married persons as single, and thus withhold more tax from their pay.

Single persons, including unmarried heads of household, can help assure the correct withholding, as well

holding System.” This document will explain how the system works. It also contains tables that will give examples that are helpful in computing the approximate withholding under the new system. Please note that the tables on the back of the “New Withholding System” document are intended as examples only and should *not* be used to compute actual withholding.

Attached to the bottom of this document is the new W-4 Form which will have printed on it your name, Life Number, Social Security Number, number of present exemptions and current marital status according to our records.

Married employees should complete and return this W-4 Form to the Payroll Section, 37 Brookhaven Avenue by *April 22nd*. Please follow the directions carefully, and give thoughts to your individual situation.

Examples of Income Tax Withholding Percentage Method

Weekly employee married two children, claiming four exemptions, wage \$130 gross weekly.

- Step I. Multiply the amount of one withholding exemption (See Table A) by the number of exemptions claimed..... $\$13.50 \times 4 = \54.00
- Step II. Subtract the amount thus determined from the employee's gross wage..... $\$130.00 - \$54.00 = \$76.00$
- Step III. Determine the amount to be withheld on \$76.00 from Table B weekly married.....
 Tax on 1st \$23.00 = \$ 2.66
 Tax on remaining \$53.00 @ 15% = \$ 7.95
 Total Federal Tax withheld \$10.61

Monthly salaried employee married, three children, claiming five exemptions, pay rate \$850.00 per month.

- Step I. Multiply the amount of one withholding exemption (See Table A) by the number of exemptions claimed..... $\$ 58.30 \times 5 = \291.50
- Step II. Subtract the amount thus determined from the employee's pay rate..... $\$850.00 - \$291.50 = \$558.50$
- Step III. Determine the amount to be withheld on \$558.50 from Table D monthly married.....
 Tax on 1st \$367.00 = \$ 51.67
 Tax on remaining \$191.50 @ 17% = \$ 32.56
 Total Federal Tax withheld \$ 84.23

Withholding. If you still desire additional tax withheld (over and above the New Graduated Withholding) you must submit a new memorandum authorizing the Payroll Section to make the additional deduction.

Percentage Method of Withholding

The Laboratory will use the Percentage Method to determine the amount of withholding. Examples of the Percentage Withholding Method are given below along with tables furnished by the Internal Revenue Service.

If you determine that under the Percentage Withholding Method the amount withheld is insufficient to

satisfy your total tax liability you should consider doing one of the following things:

Reduce the number of exemptions claimed on your new W-4.

Send a memo to the Payroll Section authorizing an additional dollar withholding.

Remember, on May 1st the Laboratory is cancelling all present requests for additional Federal Income Tax Withholding.


