## Dr. Sayre Is Member Italian Art Rescue Group

Dr. Edward V. Sayre of BNL's Chemistry Department left for Italy last Monday as part of a team of American scientists and art conservation experts assisting in emergency restoration work in the flooded museums and libraries of Florence. The 16-member group was formed in response to an appeal from Florence for technical assistance and equipment following the November 4th flood which caused inestimable damage to priceless art treasures and archives in the city.

The team includes experts on the techniques of conserving paper, painting and wood, as well as three

scientists, including Dr. Sayre, who are familiar with the chemical effects of deterioration.

Dr. Sayre is well-known for his work in the realm of fine arts and archaeology, which has been concerned to a great extent with the development of new, non-destructive methods for determining the structure and composition of works of art. He is Adjunct Professor of Fine Arts at the Conservation Center of the New York University Institute of Fine Arts.

## 'Ion-Molecule Collision Processes'

Dr. Lewis Friedman of the Chemistry Department will give the Brookhaven Lecture for November. Because of the Thanksgiving Holidays, Tuesday was selected rather than the usual Wednesday lecture date.

The lecture is titled "Ion-Molecule Collision Processes." For the past five years Dr. Friedman and a number of associates in the Chemistry Department have been studying collisions between ions and molecules in gases. They have used controlled beams of low energy ions to study collisions like those occurring in conventional chemical reactions. Their experiments have been aimed at learning how energy is transferred from one colliding particle to the other and what this implies about the mechanisms and rates of chemical reactions.

Following the lecture refreshments will be available in the Exhibit Hall.

An enthusiastic first night crowd of over two hundred BERA members, artists, and gallery hoppers celebrated the opening of the employee art show last Friday evening. The Exhibit Hall sparkled with an extraordinary variety of creative work by seventy artists in this, the biggest art show ever held at the Lab.

Even hardened habitués of the New York art scene were impressed by the quality of the exhibit, which includes, besides paintings and drawings in a wide variety of styles, graphics, collage, sculpture, tapestry, bookbinding, stained glass, miniature water color on ivory, puppets, and mosaics. The unusually fine examples of Ikebana (Japanese flower arrangements) are to be changed and varied during the show.

Some typical comments of the opening night crowd as overheard by our reporter were: *Remarkable! — Of really very high quality. — Just look at that gorgeous tapestry! — Oh George, wouldn't that painting look super over our living room couch? — That guy is wasting his time being a physicist with talent like that! — My three-year old son could do as well* (to which a nearby member of the art committee demurred politely, but suggested that if it were true, he should contribute something to the next show). *— She shows a highly interesting combination of the influence of early Picasso and late Sung Dynasty. — I didn't know they would allow that sort of thing. — Wow!*

For those who missed the opening splash, the show will run through November 23rd. The Exhibit Hall will be open from 8:30 to 5 every weekday, and in the evening, before performances of *Hotel Paradiso* on November 18 and 19, the film on November 17, and the BNL lecture on November 22.

Temporary Officers**



