Taube To Receive Award from ACS

Professor Henry Taube, chairman of the BNL Chemistry Department's Visiting Committee, will receive the American Chemical Society's 1967 Award for Distinguished Service in the Advancement of Inorganic Chemistry.

His selection was announced at the recent ACS meeting in New York. Professor Taube has been on the faculty of Stanford University since 1962. From 1946 to 1962 he was associated with the University of Chicago. He was a pioneer in the application of isotopic tracers to the study of inorganic reaction kinetics and is widely recognized as one of the leading inorganic chemists in the world.

Two former members of the BNL Chemistry Department's Visiting Committee were also honored at the ACS meeting. Dr. Ralph Connor, Vice President for Research at Rohm & Haas Company, was selected for the 1967 Priestley Medal. Dr. Joseph E. Mayer, Professor of Chemistry at the University of California at San Diego, was named for the Peter Debye Award in Physical Chemistry. Drs. Connor and Mayer were members of the Chemistry Department's Visiting Committee during the periods from 1950-1953 and 1954-1956, respectively.
