BNL Thanksgiving Four Day Holiday

At the Brookhaven Medical Research Center, Thanksgiving will be celebrated with a traditional meal complete with all the trimmings.

Dietician Norma Gillespie feels that the Thanksgiving dinner should be a feast, and is planning a meal that will include wine, shrimp cocktail, mashed turnips, onions and peas in cream sauce, and duchess potatoes. The 28-pound roast tom turkey will have chestnut dressing and giblet gravy. After the main course, homemade pumpkin pie and coffee, and assorted nuts and mints.

Chef Ed Fernandez expects to serve about 25 people including patients and staff. In the evening, turkey salad will be served for supper and the cook promises that there will probably be some picking of the carcass for those who are so inclined.

At the snack bar in the cafeteria, turkey sandwiches will be available, but no hot meals. The BNL firemen will continue their traditional custom of bringing in homemade pie to be eaten with the coffee that is available all day in the fire house.
